Where to go when you don't have services, or the services you have aren't enough

If you're not receiving services from the state Developmental Disabilities Administration (DDA), or if what you do get isn't enough, there may be resources right in your own community that can help meet some of that need while you wait for longer term supports and services.

Members of our *Informing* Families advisory committee who come from communities small and large, east and west-have found ways to tap into local resources that don't rely on state funding.

resources are ones they've found particularly helpful:

Local Parks and Recreation

Many city and county recreation programs provide opportunities that not only help build social skills and peer relationships, they can also be a form of respite for the family. Classes and events are typically listed by age: preschool, youth/teen, and adult.

Service Organizations

Non-profit community groups, such as Elks Club. Lions Club. Kiwanis, Easter Seals, as well as many church and faith organizations—such as Saint

Vincent DePaul and Bridge Ministries—have programs and activities to benefit children and adults with disabilities.

Hospitals

Hospitals provide more than health care. Some organize playgroups, summer camps and connection to other community resources.


